

## The Works Cited Page

- The Works Cited page is the last page of the research paper and is a separate page.
  - Center the words, Works Cited, at the top of the page (no bold, italics, or quotes).
  - Your sources will make up this page.
  - Double-space between the title and the first source entry.
  - Alphabetize the source cards by author's last name. The first source on this page will be the one that is first alphabetically.
  - When a source continues onto a second line, indent five spaces. This is called a hanging indent.
  - The Works Cited page is double-spaced between and within entries, but do not add additional spaces.

### **Pagination, AKA: Page Numbering**

- Page numbers should be placed in the upper right-hand corner, flush with the right margin.
- Page numbering begins with page one of your essay; however, the number one is not shown. Page two is the first page that will have an actual number. (Begin counting with page one and numbering with page two.)
- The Works Cited page also receives a number.

## Parenthetical Documentation: The Real Deal

Why?

- Parenthetical because parentheses are used
- Also known as Internal Citation
- The reader must be able to find exactly where in the source the information can be found.

Where?

- Whenever you use another's words, facts, or ideas
- At the end of the sentence: (Author's last name page number).  
The page number is the same one included on the notecard for that fact.  
\*Important: Do not place the period in the parentheses!  
Do not write page, pg., or p. Just include the number!
- Usually the author's last name and page number is sufficient, but there are other possibilities...

## A Plethora of Examples

When paraphrasing:

1. There are many forms of entertainment that teach it is tolerable to keep animals cramped, bored, and lonely (“Zoos” 1).
2. Those forms of entertainment are stage and aquatic shows, bullfights, circuses, organized dogfights, and rodeos (Parker 57).
3. For example, they put the consideration of profits over the well being of animals. They also cause the animals to lose natural hunting and breeding rituals by regulating feeding and mating (“Zoos” 1-2).

When Quoting:

1. It may be true, as Robertson maintains, that “in the appreciation of medieval art the attitude of the observer is of primary importance” (136).
2. It may be true that “in the appreciation of medieval art the attitude of the observer is of primary importance” (Robertson 136).
